Research network 3: Professionalisation of lifelong learning with special emphasis on teacher training

Conference Theme

The main conference theme focused on teachers and trainers working in adult education and their professional development. 70 Asian and European participants from over 20 ASEM countries had the opportunity to discuss key questions:

- What competences are needed in the future by educators working in the field of adult learning?
- What pathways of professionalisation are available to them in Asia and Europe?
- What are the actual impacts of teacher training on adult learning? How to measure them?
- What are the specific roles and responsibilities of adult teachers and trainers?

At the conference, researchers and practitioners exchanged and compared research results, good practices and views on the current situation of educators working in adult education and lifelong learning. Given different conceptual understandings and perspectives derived from diverse sociohistorical and economic contexts in Asian and European countries, participants emphasized the common and urgent need to qualify and professionalise teachers and trainers in order to improve quality of adult education.





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Paper Presentations

More than 40 papers about the theme of professionalisation of teachers and trainers were presented in 10 parallel workshops over two days, capturing relevant issues, such as:


- Competency models for teachers and trainers in adult education
- Teachers and trainers between responsibility and accountability
- Validation of adult educators' competences
- Effects and impacts of teacher training in LLL
- Pathways towards professionalisation
- Key competences and competence development of teachers and trainers in adult education
- Teachers and trainers roles and activities in adult education


